ORDINANCE – O2023-05-01

To: The Honorable Chair and Members of the Oconto County Board of Supervisors

Re: **Chapter 5 – Land Sale County Administration/Finances Sec. 5.101**

WHEREAS, the Administration Committee has reviewed Chapter 5 – County Administration/Finances Sec. 5.101 and recommends the following amendments.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Oconto County Board of Supervisors does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 5, County Administration/Finances Sec. 5.101 is amended as follows:

5.101 ENFORCEMENT OF COLLECTION OF TAX LIENS AND SALE OF TAX DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE

(a) Statutory Authorization. Oconto County collects delinquent taxes according to the provisions of Chapter 75, Wis. Stats. This ordinance is adopted pursuant to the authorization contained in Wis. Stats. Sec. 75.521 and Wis. Stats. Sec. 75.69.

(b) Areas To Be Regulated. All lands within the boundaries of Oconto County are subject to the terms of this ordinance.

(c) Administration. The administration of this ordinance is assigned to the Administration Committee of the Oconto County Board of Supervisors.
The Treasurer of Oconto County is hereby authorized to manage all tax-deeded lands of this County, and conduct negotiations for the sale of such lands.

Tax-deeded lands may be sold by open or closed bid, at the Treasurer's discretion.

(d) In Rem Foreclosure. From and after March 1, 2021, the Oconto County Board of Supervisors elects to adopt the provisions of Section 75.521, Wis. Stats., for the purpose of enforcing tax liens in such county in the cases where the procedure provided by such section is applicable.

Upon the adoption of such ordinance, the provisions of this section shall be applicable to such county and the treasurer need not, thereafter, proceed upon its tax certificate in cases where this section is applicable in any of the other methods provided by Wis. Stats. Sec. 75 or its charter provisions but may do so at the treasurer's option.

(e) Procedures. Real estate to which the County has acquired title by delinquent tax procedures may be sold only under the procedures of this Section.

(1) Appraisal

(A) Before placing a parcel for sale, the power of this County Board to appraise tax-deeded lands is hereby delegated to a Certified Appraiser. Minimum bids will be reviewed and approved by the Administration Committee before such sale. Statute 75.69 (1).

(B) Parcels which have been advertised for sale by a Class 3 publication at least once may have the appraisals (minimum bids) for such parcels adjusted and approved by the Administration Committee, pursuant to Wis. Stats. Sec. 75.69(1).

(2) Notice of Sale. Public notice of the sale of real estate shall be made by publishing a Class 3 notice, under Chapter 985, Wis. Stats., in a newspaper of general circulation within the County. Notice shall also be given to the clerk of the city, village, or town in which the real

56 estate is situated at least three (3) weeks prior to the sale, pursuant to Wis. Stats. Sec.

59 Prior to offering tax delinquent parcels for public sale in the first attempt, the Administration
60 Committee may accept an offer to purchase from a municipality, the State of Wisconsin or
61 the U.S. Government for any value which is deemed by the Committee to serve the
62 interests of Oconto County.

63 (3) Type of Sale

64
65 (A) (i) The County Treasurer shall send all tax deeded parcels to Wisconsin
66 Surplus Online Auction.
67

68 (ii) No bid shall be awarded or accepted by the County Treasurer for less than
69 the appraised value, or minimum bid set by the Administration Committee.
70

71 (iii)_ In the event the bidder fails to close the sale of the property by providing
72 the balance due within ten (10) days, the parcel will then be re-listed on
73 the Wisconsin Surplus Online Auction.

74 (iv) No property may be sold for an amount less than the amount of the highest
75 bid, unless the Administration Committee prepares a written statement,
76 available for public inspection, explaining the reasons for accepting a bid
77 less than the highest bid.

RESOLUTION – R2023-05-01

To: The Honorable Chair and Members of the Oconto County Board of Supervisors

Re: **American Rescue Plan Act Funding for Oconto County Youth Fair Show Ring Project**

WHEREAS, Oconto County has been allocated and received \$7,367,458 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding; and

WHEREAS, ARPA funds can be used for a government purpose assigned to the unit of government receiving funds; and

WHEREAS, county funding for fairgrounds and fairs is a government purpose, authorized under Wis. Stats. §59.56(14); and

WHEREAS, the Oconto County Youth Fair, Inc. generated \$292,745.90 in net sale proceeds from the Sale of Champions and Youth Cake auction in 2022; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 1,000 people attend the fair daily during the event; and

WHEREAS, Oconto County Youth Fair, Inc. representatives have come before the Administration Committee and outlined the building plan to expand the show ring area at the fairgrounds; and

WHEREAS, Oconto County Youth Fair, Inc. representatives have requested the County pledge support to the Oconto County Youth Fair, Inc. project in an amount not to exceed \$44,456.40; and

WHEREAS, the estimated project cost is \$148,188 and ARPA Funds will not exceed 30% of the total project cost; and

WHEREAS, the Oconto County Youth Fair, Inc. will have 20% of the project cost available to start construction; and

WHEREAS, the Oconto County Youth Fair, Inc. is a non-profit or government entity; and

WHEREAS, no additional operating funds will be made available to Oconto County Youth Fair, Inc. after project completion; and

WHEREAS, the fiscal impact of Oconto County support will be a maximum of \$44,456.40, and sufficient ARPA funds (previously allocated as lost revenue or capital projects to be determined) are available.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oconto County Board of Supervisors does hereby approve amending the American Rescue Plan Act plan to include up to \$44,456.40 for the Oconto County Youth Fair, Inc. fairgrounds show ring project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Oconto County Finance Director, County Administrator and Treasurer are authorized to release the funding after receiving confirmation from the Oconto County Youth Fair, Inc. that funds for the full project cost have been committed.

7 WHEREAS, Oconto County, like other counties in the State of Wisconsin, is currently subject to
8 various unfunded state mandates, resulting in our County Courts being forced to appoint defense counsel
9 at Oconto County (instead of State) expense; and

11 WHEREAS, Oconto County's criminal justice system has been woefully underfunded, understaffed,
12 and overworked, especially since the COVID-19 Pandemic. The County is currently experiencing a
13 ballooning amount of unresolved cases, including a backlog of numerous unissued referrals, which makes
14 the task of recruiting local prosecutors and public defenders extremely difficult; and

15
16 WHEREAS, it is vital that Oconto County be provided with the tools and investments it needs from the
17 State of Wisconsin to ensure it can meet its constitutional obligations to all Oconto County citizens currently
18 impacted by the slogged scales of justice, and we ask that the State consider the following requests when
19 developing its 2023-25 biennial budget: 1) *Increase starting prosecutor and public defender pay to \$35.00 per hour;*
20 *2) Increase all current prosecutors and public defenders pay by \$7.76 per hour; 3) Fully fund merit-based pay*
21 *progression at up to 10% per prosecutor; 4) Increase the number of assistant district attorney positions within the*
22 *Oconto County District Attorney's Office; 5) Increase the number of State Public Defender staff located in its*
23 *Peshigo office which serves both Oconto and Marinette Counties; and 6) provide \$5,000,000 annually as*
24 *reimbursements to counties across the state to cover their costs of providing court appointed counsel to defendants*
25 *when the Public Defender's Office does not; and*

26
27 WHEREAS, there are certain court user fees in Oconto County that have not been adjusted since the
28 1980s. While user fees have remained stagnant, the costs of running our courts have increased
29 dramatically. That financial hole, which is supposed to be filled by state dollars, is instead being filled with
30 local funds, and we ask that the State consider the following requests when developing its 2023-25 biennial
31 budget: 1) *Increase the jury demand fee' to between \$96 and \$192; 2) Increase the 'service by mail fee' to*
32 *\$7 or more; 3) Increase the foreign judgments fee' to \$25; 4) Increase the 'transcripts from judgment 'fee to*
33 *\$10; and 5) Increase local assistance payments to cover the increased costs of providing court interpreters*
34 *and Guardians ad Litem (GALs); and*

35
36 WHEREAS, we also ask that the. State consider other ways to help address the current backlog of cases
37 in Oconto County and to make our criminal justice system more efficient, including but not limited to: 1)
38 *Creating legislation to encourage more video conferencing (e.g., for all status conferences and pretrials),*
39 *which would increase the pool of attorneys willing to take (even out of county) cases, and would save on*
40 *costs of transporting defendants; and 2) Contracting directly with law firms to streamline the public defender*
41 *appointment process as the State of Minnesota currently does.*

43 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Oconto County Board of Supervisors hereby directs
44 that a copy of this resolution shall be emailed by the County Clerk to the following for consideration: 1) the

26 levels with those stakeholders to identify, isolate and work toward solutions for the complex issues of
27 violence; and

28
29 WHEREAS, the right of the people to keep and bear arms for defense of Life, Liberty, and Property
30 is regarded as an inalienable right by Oconto County; and

31
32 WHEREAS, the people of Oconto County derive economic benefit from all forms of firearms use,
33 including for recreation, hunting and shooting conducted within Oconto County, using all types of firearms
34 allowed under the United States Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin.

35
36 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Oconto County Board of Supervisors, that it hereby
37 opposes the enactment of any legislation unlawfully infringing on our rights under the Second Amendment,
38 and further makes clear that all lawmakers are hereby urged to honor the Second Amendment, as well as
39 Article 1, Section 25 of the Wisconsin Constitution, and to be vigilant in their duty to avoid improperly or
40 unconstitutionally abridging a citizen’s right thereunder to keep and bear arms.

41
42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Oconto County Board, hearing the will of its constituents,
43 hereby declares Oconto County to be a Second Amendment Preservation County.
