1. Call to Order

Chair Schraven called the meeting to order at 12:15 p.m.

2. Approval of Agenda

Motion by Shackelford/Poverski to approve the agenda. The motion was voted on and carried.

3. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes 04/24/2023

Motion by Shackelford/Poverski to approve the 04/24/2023 minutes. The motion was voted on and carried.

Pytleski informed the Council the bylaws were confirmed by the County Board on June 22, 2023.

5.3.1. Health & Human Services Update

Scott Shackelford, Health & Human Services Director, presented the HHS update regarding the number of youth under case management services, how many are in each program, and staff members that oversee the programs. Discussion followed.

Chris Hanke, Community Services Manager, shared that the average age of youth clients is 14 years old and provided an update on staffing patterns. Discussion followed.

6. Discuss Pretrial Diversion Programming

Group has not met. The past practice was deferred judgment agreements and identifying alternative penalties to jail time. Discussion followed.

7. Discuss Case Resolution Timeline

Discussion regarding average case timelines. The number of available public defenders and/or attorneys and the court calendars result in trial delays. Schraven will talk with DA Schuchart about possible solutions.

8. Programming

Discussed under items 6 and 7. Jail programming, Changing Courses (Changing Courses is not therapy or clinical), life and employment skills to help with reentry to society, and availability of State programming funds were discussed. Council discussed cost of Vivitrol being offered in the prison (\$1200.00/shot). BadgerCare covers the cost of the shot, but if you are in custody you don't qualify for BadgerCare. Discussion followed.
